Every topic sentence must relate to the thesis statement.

<u>Topic Sentence</u>: One sentence revealing the specific topic of your paragraph <u>State</u>: Give your opinion, thought, or idea regarding your topic (YOURS)

<u>Cite</u>: Back up your opinion by using information from other sources (don't forget to CITE!)

Explain: Give a few sentences as to how your proof and statement work together to support your thesis—answer the "So

what?" or "What importance is this proof to your paper?" **You may be asked to repeat the S— C – E steps**

<u>Summarize and extend</u>: Review but don't restate the topic. Connect the topic to larger ideas and/or bridge to next topic.
